

he junior high and high school years are crucial to creating a firm foundation for young adulthood and beyond. This reality creates a great responsibility before us as we aim to reach every last teenager in Kaufman County for Christ. These funds will allow us to create the necessary space to cultivate great hospitality, create effective events, and continue to disciple students to serve the church and share their faith both now and beyond high school. Our student ministry budget allocation is \$151,633.

t the heart of our worship collective lies a powerful commitment to creating worship experiences that transcends the ordinary, touch lives, and transform hearts. We envision a community where every individual, regardless of background, feels welcomed, inspired, and uplifted through our worship services and events. Our passion to use the arts to honor God and lead people to encounter Him drives us to continually innovate, collaborate, and pursue excellence in all six of our worship spaces. (Gospel, Contemporary, Español, Students, Children, and Kaufman Connect.) This year we expect to spend \$240,988 in pursuing that goal.



DISCIPLESHIP

n our distracted and increasingly lonely world, people need God-centered friendships more than ever. It is our goal that every person in our church would be part of a small group that connects them to God. Moreover, we desire that everyone be spiritually formed to think, feel, and act increasingly like Jesus Christ. We will spend \$116,718 on leadership, women's and men's ministries, as well as curriculum and supplies for each of these groups. Our goal is that over 750 adults will deepen friendships and follow Jesus well as a result of these expenditures.







CARE

And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others. 2 Timothy 2:2



e are most like Jesus when we share the good things of God with others. That's really at the core of our communication strategy. This year we are trying a new communication strategy based on personal connections and sharing which we hope will allow us to use fewer targeted ads, and a more human approach to meeting and inviting our neighbors to our church campus. Our \$74,548 budget will be stewarded toward existing subscription services, design services, live streaming and video creation, as well as print pieces and mass communication mediums.



ADMINISTRATION

anking fees, audits, copier contracts, construction project management, bookkeeping, and tax reports aren't very exciting, but they are an important part of our overall health as a church. This year we expect to spend \$351,329 on administrative costs.

ADMIN & FACILITIES

e have increased our ministry opportunities over the past couple of years and our campus is a wonderful tool that now serves God's purposes 7 days a week! We are all glad for this great step forward, but it is forcing us to raise the facility line item by over \$100,000. This is the area where inflation has hit us the hardest. We expect to spend \$431,594 to pay for things like utilities, building repairs, custodial help, grounds maintenance, and other operating costs over the next 12 months.

od has blessed us with a beautiful, versatile campus where we can invest our time, talents, and resources. Our budgeted debt payment for this coming year is \$420,128. City on a Hill projects will continue to be funded through gifts given beyond tithes and our general budget.

e can only do this together! After reimbursements, the total budget for the new year is \$2,499,000. Our church is made up of many families pulling together to support the different ministry opportunities that God has placed before us. Thank you for the part you will play in helping us reach our goals this year.

Fbckaufman.com/give provides a link to an online giving option. This is great for those who want to set up a recurring giving schedule.




CHURCH APP

THE GENEROSITY LADDER

This is the Generosity Ladder. It's a tool that Pastor Brent has introduced before, designed to help us all move from money being our god, to money being a tool for God and His Kingdom. The Generosity Ladder focuses on behaviors and attitudes of our hearts rather than dollars and cents. Our goal is the transformation our hearts into the likeness of Christ.



With the adoption of a new budget for the important year ahead, we're challenging everyone to identify which rung on the Generosity Ladder they most closely identify with, and then, by faith, take a next step on their personal journey of generosity.

Each rung of the ladder represents growth in a lifestyle of generosity and sacrifice. These are not rungs you slowly ascend to get to God, but simply a way to evaluate your growth in generosity. Scripture encourages us to grow in every facet of our walk with Christ, including the area of giving. (2 Corinthians 8:7)

As you begin your personal exploration with the Generosity Ladder, it's most important that you first spend time in prayer, asking the Lord where He is leading you to grow in your generosity and dependence on Him. Then, trust Him. Take the next step, and pray that God will bless our efforts in the year ahead!
